Today's Forum: Artist Talk in the Gallery. John Sterner, Lakota artist living near Marshall whose works are now on display in the Gallery, will talk about his works at Sunday Forum today. The talk is at 9:30 a.m. in the Gallery. John got his start in art doing sketches on his church's Sunday bulletins. John writes, "My mother, when I was probably about 5 years old, gave me the church bulletin and said I needed to occupy my time at church by drawing pictures. A lot of my first pictures were just doodles, small fabrications to keep my mind occupied instead of bouncing around the room, and to keep me focused on what the pastor was saying."

Staff Updates

Staff Retirements. Pastor Lois Pallmeyer, Music Director Tim Strand, and Office Coordinator Karen Earhuff have each informed the Congregation Council that they are retiring this year. **Pr. Lois**, after 26 years of joyful, wise and loving ministry at Gloria Dei, plans to retire, choosing May 18 as her farewell celebration and last Sunday. **Tim Strand**, our talented, faithful and compassionate music director for the last 16 years, has also decided that this is his year for retirement and has chosen June 22 for his farewell and last Sunday. **Karen Earhuff**, the compassionate heart of our office team, has kept the office running, the staff connected and congregation members assisted in many different ways. After 17 years at the front desk, she

will conclude her service at Gloria Dei in August. The Congregational Council and Human Resources Committee are preparing to discern how these roles might change in the future before searches begin to find replacements. Farewell celebrations will also be planned and announced as they arise to commemorate these transitions.

Worship and Music & Art

Follow Up on Sound Test, Part 2. On Sunday, March 2, we experimented with a possible update to the sound system. Loaned speaker equipment and a sound board were set up in the sanctuary to see if we could sharpen the quality of the spoken word. The results of the survey were mixed. 51% of those responding reported excellent results, but 47% gave it less than the highest rating. After worship, people stayed to respond in person to sound engineer, Bob Osgood. The issues raised in that session proved to be extremely helpful for the engineering team. Although they had planned to be done that morning, the team stayed for two additional days, revising and calibrating the system to be more effective, in time for Ash Wednesday. That evening, there were many positive responses to the changes since the Sunday before. In addition, the engineering team was able to eliminate some equipment they thought was needed but won't be, reducing the cost. They also suggested that we receive bids from additional equipment providers in order to ensure we get the lowest qualified cost. Teresa Sterns, member of the Facilities Committee and our Owner's Representative for the "Rise, O Church" renovation, has already begun drafting a request for bid proposals. The additional work and the second test gave us hope that we have moved closer to a solution. It may not be perfect for every listener, but we believe it can be substantially better for most. As plans develop, we'll keep the congregation informed. **If you attended services on both March 2 and Ash Wednesday evening, we would love to hear about your experience.**

Social Justice and Outreach

Second Offering for Neighborhood House Food Markets. The focus of March's Second Offering will be to collect money to support the food programs at Neighborhood House. This is FoodShare Month, so financial matches from Second Harvest and The Food Group multiply Neighborhood House's buying power by eight times. A \$35 donation buys \$280 worth of food; a \$150 donation has \$1,200 of purchasing power. You can give digitally anytime at tinyurl.com/gd2NDOFF25 or by putting a check in the offering plate with "Second Offering" written on the memo line. The need is great. Neighborhood House serves over 1,700 unique families in a month—nearly doubled from this time last year. Last year's Gloria Dei Second Offering total of \$3,063 would have purchasing power of \$24,504 this year. We've set this year's goal at collecting \$4,375 for a purchasing power of \$35,000, or 10% of Neighborhood House's 2025 goal of raising \$350,000 during Foodshare Month. Through last Sunday, \$2,576 has been collected.

Land Acknowledgment Statement

The congregation acknowledges that this land was taken from Indigenous people by exploitation and violence. Given the deep significance of this sacred ground, as well as its painful history, the congregation recognizes its responsibility to use this land, its building and mission for the work of reconciliation and healing with Native people. The congregation repents of this injustice that continues to harm Native communities and pledges to work for justice, peace and the wellbeing of all creation.
