Today

Installation of Interim Pastor. Pastor Sarah Henrich has been appointed by the church council to serve as Interim Associate Pastor until the congregation calls a new pastor to fill this role. She will be installed at both services today, the Day of Pentecost. She and her husband, John, have been members of Gloria Dei since 2003. She is retired as a New Testament professor at Luther Seminary and has spent much of her time since then as an interim pastor around the synod.

Worship, Music & Art

Prayers for Asylum Hearing. The Rojas's court hearing is scheduled for 1:30 p.m. on Tuesday at the Bishop Whipple Federal Building near Fort Snelling. A small group from the immigrant justice team, along with pastors, will attend to provide support. It is not advisable for others to come to the courthouse. At 1:30 p.m., a short prayer time will be held in the sanctuary at Gloria Dei. Following these prayers, the sanctuary will be open for solidarity prayer until 4:30 p.m. The results of the hearing will be reported by the immigrant justice team at the appropriate time.

June Organ Recitals. Gloria Dei is hosting organ recitals Fridays at noon through June again this year, highlighting our new Letourneau/ Casavant pipe organ. Art-in-Worship Grant. Glor ia Dei has been selected to participate in the Twin Cities cohort of the "Worshiping with Children: Imaging and Imagining the Presence of God" program. Thanks to the Lilly Endowment's Nurturing Children Through Worship and Prayer Initiative and Phillips Theological Seminary, Tulsa, OK, we are one of five congregations in the Twin Cities area which will receive funding to embark on a year's worth of projects. The Imaging and Imagining God Program is centered in Sunday worship and is focused on cultivating sacred spaces through which children will come to know and love God and grow in their faith. Program funding supports each congregation's creative team as it learns about liturgical seasons, art and the power of liturgical space, child development and its work to prepare visual art in their sanctuaries for the seasons of the church year.

Land Acknowledgment Statement

Gloria Dei Lutheran Church recognizes that its building stands on traditional Dakota land near Bdote Mni Sota, the confluence of the Minnesota and Mississippi rivers, the center of creation for Dakota people and also sacred to Ojibwe. The congregation acknowledges that this land was taken from Indigenous people by exploitation and violence. Given the deep significance of this sacred ground, as well as its painful history, the congregation recognizes its responsibility to use this land, its building and mission for the work of reconciliation and healing with Native people. The congregation repents of this injustice that continues to harm Native communities and pledges to work for justice, peace and the wellbeing of all creation.
